

CHA Parents/Students:

A new executive order was released by Governor Reeves on Friday that we fall under as it relates to extracurricular activities for all students K-12. We will follow the guidelines as stated in the order and need help by everyone and cooperation to assure compliance. These directives must be followed by one and all. The executive order is for the next two weeks. It may change, be extended, or both.

Attendees at pee wee, junior high, and varsity football games will be limited to only two (2) spectators for each player, cheerleader, and dance team member. Coaches, sponsors for cheerleaders and dance team, trainers, chain crew, announcers, film crew, gate workers and other volunteers will be admitted. Tickets will be sold to players, cheerleaders, and dance team members by their respective coach/sponsor which they can then deliver to those attending. NO tickets will be sold at the gate and no one will be admitted without a ticket, MAIS pass, or coaches pass. A listing of volunteers will be compiled and checked off as they come through the gate. The same procedures will be employed for all athletic events for the next 2 weeks.

Pee wee football games will begin at 5:00 pm. Gates will open at 4:00 pm. No one will park inside fence except coaches and varsity players. No tents will be allowed for any game. No admissions sold at gate. Everyone entering must have a ticket, approved pass, or be on the volunteer list.

At the conclusion of the pee wee game, everyone must exit the stadium. When the stadium is cleared, we will begin the admission process to the junior high game. The same rules of admission as stated above will be in force for the junior high game. We hope to start no later than 7:00 pm. Parents that have students participating in both games will be given a special ticket indicating such.

Varsity football games will be handled in the same format as above. Tickets (2) will be sold to football players, cheerleaders, and dance team members and must be presented at the gate. Approved passes (MAIS and coaches pass) will be accepted. Volunteers will be on a pass list and checked in at the gate.

Considerations:

- 1) Bleacher capacity is regulated (100-150) fans and social distancing must be practiced whether in the stands or sitting around the field.
- 2) You must wear a mask to enter the stadium. Masks must be worn at all times upon entering and when around other fans.
- 3) Temperatures for all players, coaches, support staff and volunteers will be taken.
- 4) We ask that anyone who has a compromised immune system or is considered high risk not attend.
- 5) Practice good sanitation habits at all times. Sanitation stations will be available throughout the stadium.

- 6) Shop the concession stand when not crowded. Avoid crowds and maintain distancing.
- 7) Help us maintain a safe facility by disposing of all trash.
- 8) Please social distance whether in stands or sitting in chairs around the stadium. The number of attendees should be lower than normal and this will be helpful.

We have made progress in complying with guidelines and know that our students and fans want us to move forward and be able to continue participation in our extracurricular activities. We must all remember that this is about giving our young people the opportunity to participate!
